Aim: Develop Listening and reading skills.

Materials:

- Second Chapter of Beatles Movie "A Hard day's night" (The Beatles, & Lester, R. (1964) A hard day's night. UK: United Artist)
- Handout with the name of the characters.
- Handouts with the dialogue without the name of the characters.
- Handouts with the characters in.

Procedure

- 1. Students are provided with several lines of dialogue and the names of the characters in the video.
- 2. Students watch the video the chosen fragment of the movie with the sound off
- 3. Then, they match each line of dialogue with the name of the character most likely to have said it.
- 4. They watch the video again and see if they were correct in matching the dialogue.
- 5. They are handed the dialogue with the characters in, to see if they were right.
