Who is responsible and why?

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Level: Intermediate to advanced (adults) **Aims:** Speaking reading and Writing.

Time: 60 min

Procedure:

1. Speaking: Write down on the board these questions (might be useful to have the questions on index cards).

Do you think that being alone is a good reason to look for a lover?

Are you obligated to help a friend? Why?

How often do you help strangers on the street? Why?

Would you help anybody for money?

Do you think that insane people should be forgiven for the things they do?


Ask the students to stand up and ask these questions to 2 or 3 different persons.


- **2.** Elicit information from the prior questions.
- **3.** Show a picture and elicit information, age, relationship and about what happened before the picture. (Appendix 1)
- **4.** Hand in pictures with visual and ask students to write a conversation between the 2 characters (appendix 2)
- 5. Have students read their conversations.
- 6. Elicit information about what happened after the picture
- 7. Hand in reading and have students read; who is responsible for the woman's death? (Appendix 3)
- **8.** Make groups of 4 to 5 students

Mutual dictation

- **9.** Stick statements (appendix 4) on the board and have students race to the board to read one statement, the student returns to where his team is and dictates what he read, the students change places. The team that finishes first wins
- **10.** Have students arrange the statements in chronological order.
- **11.** Have students retell the story in their own words. Write the character of the story n the board.
- **12.** Ask students to sit in pairs, decide and arrange which of these people has the most responsibility for her death: the woman, her husband her lover, the stranger, her childhood friend, or the maniac being 1 the most and 6 the least responsible.
- **13.** Sit them with another pair and discuss the same (group of 4)
- **14.** Sit them with another group and decide the same (group of 4) until the whole group comes to an agreement.
